First Aid Needs Assessment



How many qualified First Aiders do you need? Which courses are best suited for your workplace? A first aid needs assessment will help you answer these questions.

Hazards: Hazards might be specific to your type of work, e.g. chemical exposure from working with industrial solvents, or more general, e.g. fractures from slipping on wet floors. You will need to assess the likelihood of any incidents and the seriousness of resulting injuries and ill health. The specific hazards in your workplace will affect what your first aiders need to learn.

People: The number of people present will affect how many first aiders you will need. This could change on different days of the week or at different times of day depending on shifts and remote working schedules. This includes employees, visitors, contractors, etc. You will need to make sure you have enough first aiders to cover absences and holidays.

History: Consider the history of first aid in your workplace and whether you need to make changes to prevent future incidents.

Needs: The needs of staff and visitors may include disabilities, mental health issues, and lone working. The needs of the people in your workplace will affect what your first aiders need to learn.

Location: If your workplace is split into multiple sites, you will need first aiders for each site. If your workplace is especially remote or difficult to access, your first aiders may need more advanced or specialist training.

How Many First Aiders?

There are no exact rules as the number of first aiders you need will depend on your specific workplace. There must always be at least one appointed person available whenever people are at work.

Which Course?

In order to become a qualified first aider, you will need to complete the Level 3 Award in First Aid At Work or the Level 3 Award in Emergency First Aid At Work. We offer optional additional content for these courses (see above).

Our Recommendations

Low Risk Workplaces: (e.g. offices) should have at least one first aider on site whenever people are at work.

Our Level 3 Award in Emergency First Aid At Work can qualify first aiders for low risk workplaces, but the Level 3 Award in First Aid At Work is best to prepare for a wider range of scenarios.

The HSE recommend any companies with more than 25 people have at least one first aider on-site, even in low-risk environments.

High Risk Workplaces: (e.g. construction) should have multiple first aiders based on the size and specific risks of each site.

First aiders should complete our Level 3 Award in First Aid At Work. You should also consider additional training for handling specific risks.
