What is a Co-Trainer?

Co-trainers help other trainers to teach Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training.

If you live as an autistic person or live with a learning disability, you are an expert with lived experience of autism or learning disabilities.

Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training

Oliver McGowan was an autistic man with a learning disability. After he died, his mum, Paula, campaigned for better training for health and social care staff. Find out more at www.olivermcgowan.org

The training is co-delivered by people with lived experience of autism and learning disabilities. That's why we need you.

What will I need to do?

- Talk about your life and experiences to help people understand autism and learning disabilities.
- Answer questions.
- Work in a team with other trainers who will support you.

You may need to travel to in-person courses or log on to online courses.

What skills do I need?

You must be able to:

- Speak in front of a group of up to 30 people.
- Listen carefully and understand what others are saying.
- Be organised to travel to training venues and arrive on time. We can support you with this.







What experience do I need?

You do not need any previous job experience.

You must be an autistic person or have a diagnosed learning disability such as Global Development Delay; Downs Syndrome; or Cerebral Palsy. Other diagnosed Learning Disabilities are also accepted.

What will I get?

We pay our co-trainers £20 for each hour of training delivery.

The job has flexible hours with a zero-hour contract. This means you will not work a set number of hours every week.

The job will help you:

- Gain independence and confidence.
- Progress in a career.
- Make life better for people like you.

What support is available?

We will make reasonable adjustments to make sure you can do the job.

You can call, message or email your manager if you need help.

Here are some examples of the support we give:

- Teach to do the job before you start.
- Create step-by-step travel plans.
- Provide Easy Read and Braille documents.
